The long term goal was placement of State Wards in a least restrictive environment, such as: adoptive placement, long-term foster care, or reunification with the family.

Also chaired and supervised the streamlining of the Utilization Review Committee as part of maintaining the JCAHO accreditation of ENCOMH. Pursued research efforts regarding the club house model of day rehabilitation and employment.
